**A BRIEF HISTORY**

9 RAR was raised at Keswick Barracks Adelaide on 13 Nov 67. On that day it consisted of the Commanding Officer, LTCOL A.L. Morrison, MBE, six other officers and three other ranks. It moved to Woodside about a week later. The Battalion reached full strength in Apr 68.

On 5 Nov 68, an advance party of 150 commanded by MAJ J.M. Stewart, OC Admin Coy, arrived in Vietnam. On 9 Nov 68 the main body left Adelaide in HMAS SYDNEY. Having departed the last Australian port, 9 RAR was officially on active service when it celebrated its first birthday at sea on 13 Nov 68. The main body arrived in Vietnam on 20 Nov 68.

9 RAR began major operations on 10 Dec 68. During its tour, the Battalion carried out 11 major operations each of about a month in duration as well as several other shorter operations. The operations were mounted in Phuoc Tuy, Long Khanh, Bien Hoa and Binh Tuy provinces. One DSO, two MCs, seven MMs and eight MIDs were awarded to members of the Battalion during this tour of duty in Vietnam.

On 28 Nov 69, the unit departed from South Vietnam to return to Adelaide where they received a rousing reception.

9 RAR re-formed at Enoggera in Jan 70 when LTCOL E.R. Phillip assumed command.

The Battalion remained at Enoggera under the command of LTCOL E.R. Phillip until Aug 71. LTCOL J. Essex-Clark assumed command from that date until the linking with 8 RAR on 31 Oct 73 to form the new Battalion, 8/9 RAR.
